

Old Mill District

McKay Park

This park is the site of the Oregon Trail Railroad interpretive sign, which describes Bend's early railroad history. Named for Clyde McKay, McKay Park was opened in May 2000 and quickly became a very popular addition to the District's collection of riverfront parks. McKay Park is an excellent choice for taking a break from the

spirit. This popular gathering place hosts

events throughout the spring, summer and fall. Features include nearly one half mile of riverfront, acres of open lawn, an outdoor stage, restrooms and small picnic tables.

Mirror Pond

Mirror Pond is the area of the Deschutes River located in downtown Bend between Galveston Bridge and Newport Bridge, where the river widens as it winds its way past Harmon, Pageant, Drake, and Brooks parks and residential properties. An identifying feature of the City of Bend since

the early 1900s, Mirror Pond is created by the Pacific Power and Light hydroelectric dam that is located just downstream Newport Avenue Bridge.

Sawyer Park

This large park stretches along both sides of the Deschutes River. Formerly a state park dedicated to the District in 1980, it was named for Robert W. Sawyer, former owner and publisher of The Bulletin and a man dedicated to preservation of natural areas and establishment of parks all over Oregon. The park is connected by trail to



Neighborhood Natural Area.

Bend Pkwy

A footbridge over the river leads to the Deschutes River Trail and connections to First Street Rapids Park, Sawyer Uplands Park and Archie Briggs Natural Area. The park has a mix of mature pine and juniper. It is a popular viewing site for migratory and riparian birds and is listed on the Oregon Cascade Birding Tour route.

Archie Briggs H Canyon Open Space

The park belongs to the county of Deschutes. This steep canyon rim affords stunning views of Mount Washington and Black Butte to the northwest and the Deschutes River far below. This is the perfect place when you
