

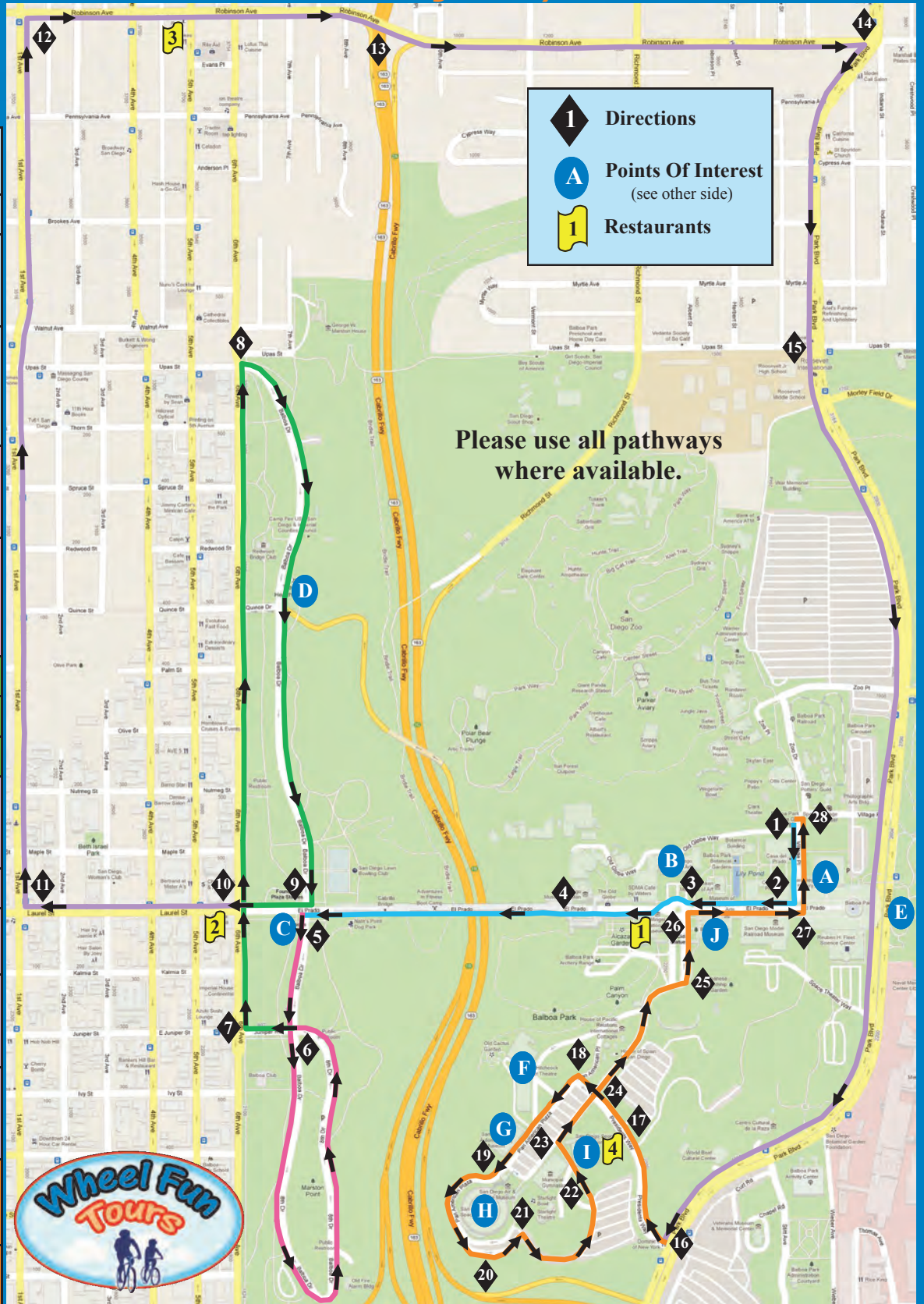


Self-Guided Bicycle Tour Balboa Park & Hillcrest

A scenic 3 - 4 hour tour, includes approximately 1 - 1.5 hours of riding time and 2+ hours for lunch, shopping and exploring along the way.

**1660 Old Globe Way
- Next to the Village Grill -**

1	Exit Wheel Fun Rentals to the right onto Village Place.
2	Turn right onto El Prado.
3	Continue on El Prado, crossing on the right of the fountain at Plaza de Panama.
4	Use the covered pathway along The Museum of Man, and continue over the Cabrillo Bridge.
5	Turn left onto Balboa Drive (you will loop around a grassy park area).
6	Continue straight through the intersection onto Juniper Road, on the sidewalk to your left.
7	Turn right onto Sixth Avenue.
8	Turn right onto Balboa Drive.
9	Turn right onto El Prado.
10	El Prado becomes Laurel Street after crossing Sixth Avenue.
11	Turn right onto First Avenue.
12	Turn right onto Robinson Avenue.
13	Continue on Robinson Avenue across the 163 Freeway overpass.
14	At the five-point intersection, make a hard, immediate right onto Park Boulevard.
15	Crossing Upas Street, you will re-enter Balboa Park; continue on Park Boulevard.
16	Turn right onto Presidents Way, staying on the sidewalk.
17	Continue on Presidents Way until it dead-ends in the Pan American Plaza parking lot.
18	Continue across the parking lot, there will be a one-way arrow sign directly in front of you, turn left. Follow the one-way arrows painted on the asphalt toward the Aerospace Museum.
19	Exit the parking lot and merge onto the path to the right of the Aerospace Museum (A Blackbird jet will be to your
20	Follow this path around the Aerospace Museum and it will lead you into another parking lot.



21	Follow the painted arrows around the parking lot, continuing straight onto the sidewalk that is ahead of you. Turn right on the sidewalk.
22	Stay along the sidewalk until you leave the parking lot and turn left into the second driveway, following the path along the left side of the San Diego Hall of Champions Sports Museum.
23	Exit out into the parking, turn right and follow the one-way arrows to exit the lot.
24	Continue straight at the stop sign onto Pan American Road East.
25	Continue straight on Pan American Road East, keeping right at the fork in the road.
26	Continue riding into the Plaza de Panama's parking lot, turning right past the Visitors Center & Prado Restaurant, onto El Prado.
27	Turn left onto Village Place.
28	Return to Wheel Fun Rentals on your left.

Be safe, cross busy streets at stop signs & stoplights, and watch for cars.

A San Diego Natural History Museum



The museum's award-winning exhibit design team creates exhibitions on the unique and bio-diverse southern California region.

B San Diego Museum of Art

As the region's oldest and largest art museum, the San Diego Museum of Art's renowned holdings include a fine selection of European old masters, 19th and 20th century American art, an encyclopedic Asian collection, and growing collections of contemporary and Latin American art.

C Kate Sessions Statue

The statue, by artist Ruth Hayward, depicts the "Mother of Balboa Park". Many of the older trees throughout Balboa Park were planted by her.



D Trees for Health Garden

The garden features plants, such as a Ginkgo, Cinnamon, Jujube, Coffee Berry and Mulberry, with maps available to help you explore their medicinal properties.



E Inez Grant Parker Memorial Rose Garden



In peak bloom from April - May, the gardens are home to 2,500 rose bushes in over 180 varieties.

F Marie Hitchcock Puppet Theater

Founded in the late 1940s, the Marie Hitchcock Puppet Theater is a longtime San Diego tradition for children. The theater also provides a venue for its resident puppeteers, who work with marionettes, hand, rod, and shadow puppets.

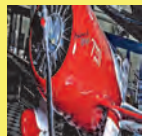
G San Diego Automotive Museum



A nostalgic look at the icons of the 20th-century features more than 80 historic autos and motorcycles. Special exhibitions every three months display other fine vehicles and famous autos.

H San Diego Air & Space Museum

An affiliate of the Smithsonian Institute, the Museum houses a collection of historic air and spacecrafts from all over the world, including a working replica of The Spirit of St. Louis and the actual Apollo 9 Command Module spacecraft.



I San Diego Hall of Champions Sports Museum

The nation's largest multi-sport museum boasts memorabilia reflecting San Diego's sporting legacy. Visitors can call play-by-play for Ted Williams in the state-of-the-art media center, follow the evolution of the surfboard, or soar with skateboarding legend Tony Hawk.

J Museum of Photographic Arts

The Museum of Photographic Arts houses more than 7,000 works, representing the entire history of photography. The museum's collection is particularly strong in modern and contemporary work. The museum is also home to a state-of-the-art movie theater.
