Fairmount Park was established in 1855, one of the first urban parks in the United States. The park stretches from here north to the mouth of the Wissahickon Creek, and is named for "Faire Mount", the hill on which the art museum now stands.

FAIRMOUNT WATER WORKS

The scenic Fairmount Water Works is a National Historic Landmark located a short distance from here. Operated from 1815 to 1909, river water was originally pumped up to a reservoir where the art museum now stands.

The site is known for its impressive machinery and architecture. Nearby paths above the river feature sculptures by William Rush, America's first sculptor.

Explore the Water Works today, from the unique viewpoint of a bike! Learn more about the site at the Interpretive Center, located below the deck.
