

F POINTS OF INTEREST

(see map for location)

- A. **Queensway Bay** Enjoy the jaw-dropping views of boats moored in Queensway Bay.
- B. **Queen Mary** This luxury ocean liner was launched in 1934, and over 33 years it completed 1001 cruises before being docked permanently in Long Beach. The proud ocean liner is now an elegant floating hotel.
- C. **Rainbow Harbor** The harbor has 87 slips for commercial and recreational vessels. Enjoy this traditional boardwalk with funnel cones, fudge shops, popcorn, and more!
- D. **Aquarium of the Pacific** This aquarium houses over 11,000 marine animals. Highlights include 19 major Pacific Ocean habitats and 32 smaller focus exhibits.
- E. **The Pike** Having opened in 1902, The Pike is a historic beachfront amusement zone. With restaurants, Ferris wheel, and an open-air marketplace. The Pike is one of the most colorful and unique waterfront locations on the West Coast.
- F. **Long Beach Museum of Art** Located in the Bluff Park neighborhood, this impressive museum complex overlooks the Pacific Ocean. Founded in 1950, the LBMA features a historic mansion and art galleries. Try the banana bread pudding at Claire's, the museum's ocean front café.
- G. **Belmont Pier** The current 1,620 foot-long concrete pier was built in 1966, replacing a wooden pier that stood for over 50 years.
- H. **Naples** These charming islands are fashioned after the famous Italian waterfront community. There are canals with Gondola boats, cozy cottage waterfront homes, and a beautiful water fountain at the center of the Naples Plaza.
- I. **Alamitos Bay** Check out these family friendly beaches for sunbathing, kayaking, and water sports. Tucked away between Long Beach and Seal Beach, Alamitos Bay is named for the Spanish word "little poplars."
- J. **Stingray Bay** Nicknamed "Ray Bay" by local surfers, the mouth of the San Gabriel River is teeming with stingrays due to the river's slightly warmer water.
- K. **Seal Beach Pier** The pier's boardwalk begins at Eisenhower Park and continues to the beach. At 1,835 feet long, it's the sixth longest wooden pier in California.
- L. **Downtown Seal Beach** A haven for those in search of a laid-back hometown atmosphere. You'll find a quaint business district and a variety of restaurants.
- M. **Bixby Park** With a band shell stage, sports field, BBQ pits, volleyball courts, and a skate park, Bixby Park is a great stop for your enjoyment.

Bike Safe!

Proceed through streets and intersections carefully. Be courteous of pedestrians and don't forget water and sunscreen. For safety and comfort, wear your helmet and comfortable clothing. Obey all laws and enjoy!

Turn By Turn Directions (continued)

- 8** If starting from Alamitos Beach, exit Wheel Fun Rentals and turn left onto the beach bike path, continue past Belmont Pier, towards Naples. The path curves right, ending at the intersection of Ocean Blvd. and 54th Pl. Continue straight onto 54th Pl.
- 9** Follow 54th Place as it veers right, becoming Bay Shore Ave. Note: if traffic is present, you may ride the sidewalk on the left.
- 10** Turn right on 2nd St., then right on The Toledo, continuing on The Toledo past the fountain.
- 11** Keep right at the fork, turning on E. Neapolitan Ln.
- 12** Immediately after bridge, walk your bike down the steps to the right onto waterfront path.
- 13** Follow path past Long Beach Yacht Club. At the first structure, exit left through parking lot and continue straight on The Toledo.
- 14** Turn right on Naples Plaza, right on E. 2nd St., then right on Marina Dr., continuing along river.
- 15** Turn left at Alamitos Bay Landing, crossing the bridge, then right on 1st St.
- 16** Turn left on Ocean Ave., left on Main St., then left on Central Ave. towards Marina Dr.
- 17** Merge left onto Marina Dr., continuing across bridge, turn right at Alamitos Bay Landing.
- 18** Continue on Marina Dr. along harbor, turn left onto 2nd St., then cross the bridge.
- 19** Turn left on Bayshore Ave., then left where Bayshore Ave. and 54th Pl. split, so you are on 54th Pl.
- 20** At the end of 54th Pl., turn right onto the bike path.
- 21** Continue to Shoreline Village and return to Wheel Fun Rentals! **If you started at Alamitos Beach,** continue through Shoreline Village and follow direction #1 through #7. back to Wheel Fun Rentals Alamitos Beach at Direction #8.

Turn By Turn Directions

- 1** If starting from Shoreline Village, exit Wheel Fun Rentals to the left (facing away from the building), following the parking lot past the Yard House.
- 2** Turn left and follow the cobblestone sidewalk along the water.
- 3** Continue on the path around Rainbow Harbor, past the lighthouse, staying along the water.
- 4** Exit the path on Golden Shore outlet at the roundabout before the bridge, keeping to the right side of the street, past Aquarium of the Pacific. Turn right on Aquarium Way.
- 5** Cross Shoreline Dr. using crosswalk and immediately turn right, onto path.
- 6** Crossing Pine Ave., follow path along the lagoon, then turn right on Shoreline Village Dr.
- 7** Continue on path through Marina Green Park, at the path's end, turn left along the beach path.
